

Former MOD homes are ready to be sold

EX-MARRIED QUARTERS GOING ON THE MARKET

PLYMOUTH homeseekers have the opportunity to snap up former Royal Navy quarters in Plymstock which have been refurbished and are set to go on the market this summer.

The former Ministry of Defence properties are all three-bedroom houses suitable for first time buyers and families and will be starting at £240,000.

The ex-married quarters are being marketed by Annington Homes, and there have been over 80 enquiries already from eager local buyers. The new homes will be located on Holmwood Avenue in Plymstock, just outside of Plymouth and those who have served in the Armed Forces will be offered a services discount.

The properties have local amenities within 10 minutes' walking distance, as well as a local primary school and children play areas.
