

## School gets help to boost outdoor learning efforts

YOUNG naturalists are being encouraged to learn more about wildlife with the gift of animal houses and feeders for its nature area.

Rush Common School's forest programme aims to encourage outdoor learning and to promote self-

esteem, creativity and confidence within the children.

Items given to the school included bug pots, binoculars, magnifying glasses, pond nets, a hedgehog house, bird boxes and feeders.
