REFLECTING CHALLENGE

This year's Annington Challenge - Annington's project for military youngsters that runs in partnership with the Outward Bound Trust has once again proved to be the highlight of the summer for a fortunate and deserving few, including 25 RAF youngsters.



ANNINGTON Challenge

The Annington Challenge provides military youngsters from all over the UK with an opportunity to experience an Outward Bound course and is aimed at those who feel they would benefit from an experience proven to improve self-confidence and self-belief, team working skills and resilience. Recommended by their teachers, our youngsters aged 13-17 spent between 7-19 days experiencing the very best of the Outward Bound's courses at two of their fantastic centres – Aberdovey in North Wales and Ullswater in Cumbria.

Many of this year's RAF participants had secured a place in 2020 but had seen hopes dashed as the Outward Bound closed their centres as the full impact of the Pandemic began to be felt. Reopening in 2021 required a restriction on numbers and meant smaller groups and no sharing of dormitories – but despite this, fun levels were just as high as in previous years!

The RAF youngsters enjoyed a whole host of outdoor activities that included everything from sailing, abseiling and rock climbing through to wild camping, canoeing and gorge walking. All aspects of the programmes were overseen by the Outward Bound's team of hugely experienced and qualified outdoor instructors - many of whom who have worked with previous Annington Challenge participants. They encouraged our youngsters as they tackled activities designed to take them outside their comfort zones - and beyond.

Next year the Annington Challenge celebrates its tenth anniversary and applications are now open!

Alex tackled a five day course at the Outward Bound Centre in Aberdovey and found the activities more challenging than he had expected and readily admits that support from the others in his group plus instructor Chris made all the difference.

"The expedition to Cader Idris was quite challenging but the others kept me going. Looking back I am glad I did it - glad I had people pushing me on. I definitely enjoyed the experience. The whole Challenge reminded me of how much I enjoy being outside and not just playing video games."

"Do it! It's fun and exciting. You are constantly supported and have people looking out for you — the other participants as well as the instructors."
