

» Primary school takes on Annington's reading challenge

A school in Swanton Morley has been challenged to bring stories to life.

Swanton Morley Primary School participated in Annington's Reading Challenge and was visited by a storyteller from Epic Tales Storytelling.

This initiative by Annington aims to encourage more children to enjoy reading. The primary school, which is located near Annington's Worthing Fields homes, is the second school in the area to take part in the challenge.

Five primary schools near Annington's home locations participated in this reading programme.

With the help of storyteller Chip Colquhoun from Epic Tales, pupils enjoyed an afternoon workshop and were treated to three stories, including one about a young boy named Boot who outsmarted a troll.

The class teacher played the troll, and the children enjoyed squirting her with water to defeat the beast.
